Activities:

Battery D, Second Field Artillery, organized August 4, 1917 was one of the National Guard organizations comprising the regiment of "Grizzlies", The term "Grizzlies" was applied to the Second Field Artillery as it was the only California regiment composed entirely of local troops. Battery D had an enrollment of seventy members when the organization was mustered in as a unit of the California National Guard on August 4, 1917, although enlistments were afterwards accepted until war strength was reached. This unit, as part of the Second Field Artillery, was in the National Guard service only one day when it was mustered into Federal Service for duty in the World War. Upon entering Federal Service, Battery D was redesignated Battery D, 144th Field Artillery.***
