1. A suggested design of distinctive insignia for the 40th Infantry Brigade is forwarded for your consideration. It is described as follows:

DESCRIPTION

A gold color metal and enamel device 1 1/8 inches in width overall consisting of a blue enamel triangular area surmounted by a gold semi-sunburst, at the top a gold demi-fleur-de-lis between a background of Philippine sun rays, in base a blue enamel Torri gate behind a vertical red enamel arrowhead (point up, and extending slightly in front of the sunburst), all above a circular gold scroll inscribed "Duty Honor Courage" in red enamel letters.

SYMBOLISM

The semi-sunburst was suggested by the unit's shoulder sleeve insignia and represents the Brigade's home area of Long Beach, California. The demi-fleur-de-lis symbolizes service in World War I. The outer rim of sun rays refers to the Philippine Presidential Unit Citation award. The red arrowhead alludes to the fire power of the unit and represents their assault landing at Luzon in World War II. The Torri gate, a symbol of the Far East, refers to the awarded Republic of Korea Presidential Unit Citation.

2. Upon return of the correspondence with your comments and/or concurrence in the design, action will be taken toward approval. The suggested design is to be returned with the correspondence.





1. Coats of Arms and Distinctive Insignia have been approved for the 144th Artillery and 160th Infantry, parent regiments reorganized under the Combat Arms Regimental System. Copies of the authorization letters with illustrations of the designs are inclosed (Incl 3-4). All organic elements of CARS regiments are required to wear the same distinctive insignia. There is no indication in the records of this Institute that the 140th Cavalry has been authorized a coat of arms and distinctive insignia.

 - a. HHC, 40th Infantry Brigade
 - b. 140th Aviation Company
 - c. 140th Engineer Company
 - d. Troup E, 140th Cavalry
4. A certificate of lineage and honors has been requested from The Office of the Chief of Military History for the 540th Support Battalion. Upon receipt and review of the lineage the organization will be advised of its heraldic entitlements through channels.

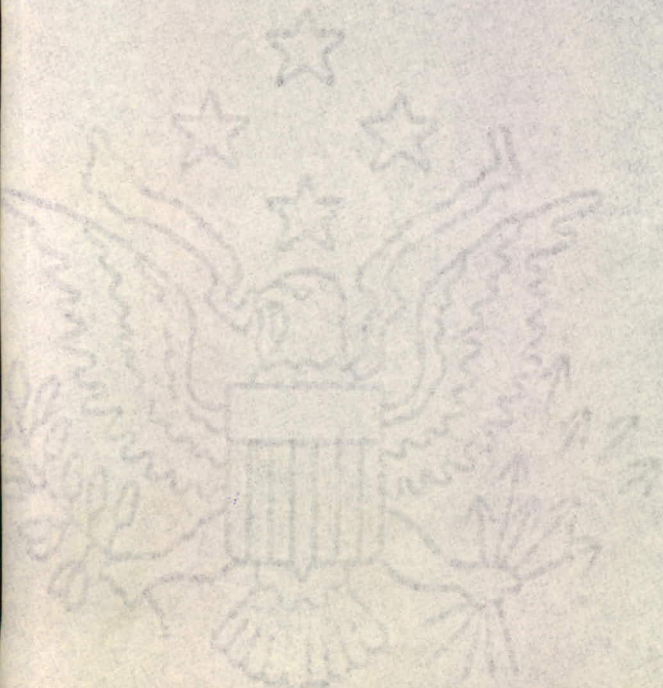


