Activities:

Company F was organized January 26, 1888, and was attached to the Sixth Infantry Battalion, Third Brigade.* One of the stipulations in the Special Order was that the Company was not entitled to a State allowance until proper provision had been made by the Legislature for the same. Company F, together with the five companies already in the battalion, were the minimum requirement for a regimental organization. At a meeting of the officers of the battalion it was decided to raise the battalion to a regiment. Consequently, Company F, less than a month after organization, became Company F of the Sixth Infantry Regiment, Third Brigade.**
