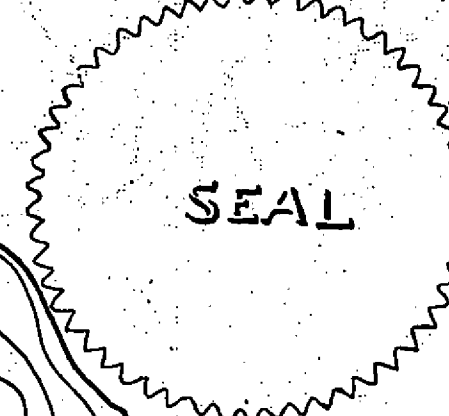

**LEGEND**

The military reservation of Angel Island containing about 640 acres is situated in San Francisco Bay about 7 miles to the northeast of the city of San Francisco. It was reserved for military purposes by Executive Orders dated Nov. 6, 1850 and Apr. 20, 1860. Jurisdiction ceded by State Legislature March 31, 1891. Exclusive jurisdiction ceded March 2, 1897. (Cal. Stats. 1897, P. 51). Title to certain tide water lands etc. was ceded by the State March 9, 1897. The Sec. of War July 8, 1903 and April 6, 1909 transferred to the Dept. of Commerce and Labor two parcels of land aggregating about 14 acres for the purpose of an immigrant detention station. Revocable license dated Dec. 22, 1888 to Treasury Dept. to use about 10 acres for a quarantine station. Revocable license dated July 15, 1909 to the Spring Valley Water Co. to install and maintain two meters (one at Fort McDowell and the other at Recruit Depot). On April 4, 1910 The Asst. Sec. of War approved the landing of cable near Point Blunt and running overland to Immigration Station as requested by Sec. of Commerce and Labor. For minor licenses see book on Military Reservations etc. prepared in the Office of the Judge Advocate General U.S. Army.
