Activities:

The Twenty-Second Company, Coast Artillery Corps, National Guard of California was organized in Los Angeles, on October 4, 1916. L. W. Stampley was elected Captain and Louis O. LaMont was chosen First Lieutenant of the new Company. Like other units in the newly organized Second Coast Defense Command, the Twenty-Second Company entered upon a vigorous program of drills, lectures and various schools of instruction for non-commissioned officers and enlisted men. One holiday parade in Pasadena, July 4, 1917, was reported by the Company.

On August 29, 1917, the Twenty-Second Company was mustered into Federal Service for duty during the World War and was redesignated Tenth Company, Second Coast Defense Command, Los Angeles.
