Activities:

On February 3, 1921, the Adjutant General of the State of California, issued Special Order Number Seven, authorizing Captain John F. Winburn to organize a Coast Artillery Company to be located at San Diego, California. In compliance with the order, Captain Winburn organized an Artillery Company which was mustered into the service of the State of California, February 10, 1921, and was designated as Fifth Company, Coast Artillery Corps. Captain John F. Winburn and First Lieutenant Josef D. Lane were placed in command of the new Com-

Fifth Company, Coast Artillery Corps, was organized and mustered into the service of the State of California, March 1, 1921. First Lieutenant, Joseph H. [Name], of the Fifth Company, Coast Artillery Corps, was placed in command of the Fifth Company with regular officers were assigned. On March 14, 1921, Special Order No. 12, Adjutant General's Office, was issued, wherein [Name] was promoted as Captain and [Name] was promoted as First Lieutenant of the Company, relieving [Name] as First Lieutenant [Name] was then in temporary command of the unit.
