#### Activities:

Sixth Company, Grast Artillery Corps, was organized and mustered into the service of the State of California, March 1, 1921, First Lieutenant, Josef D. Lane, of the Fifth Company, Coast Artillery Corps, was placed in command of the Sixth Company until regular officers were assigned. On March 14, 1921, Special Order No. 22, Adjutant General's Office, was issued, wherein Luthur C. Thornton was named as Captain and Millard Greenbaum as First Lieutenant of the Company, relieving First Lieutenant Cane, who had been in temporary command of the Unit.

Sixth Company, Coast Artillery Corps, was inspected for Federal recognition, March 15, 1921, by Colonel Robert H. Moble, United States Army.

On May 9, 1921, the Company was redesignated and became Sixth Company, Provisional Battalion, Coast Artillery Corps.

From the date of its organization and muster into the service of the State on March 1, 1921, the activities of the Sixth Company consisted only of drill maneuvers until July 1, 1921, when the Unit was again redesignated as Sixth Company, Coast Defense Command, Coast Artillery Corps, California National Guard.
