Activities:

First Separate Company Infantry was mustered into the Service of the National Guard on February 13, 1924. The officers elected to command the unit were Harold D. Kaye, Captain, and Henry E. R. Wallace, First Lieutenant.

The company was organized as an unattached unit, but expected to become attached to an Infantry Regiment. On July 1, 1924, the First Separate Company was redesignated Company F, 149th Infantry.
