The Second Separate Company of Fresno was organized on October 4, 1920 with Lloyd T. Stephenson as Captain and Oscar O. Collins as First Lieutenant. The unit was in existence as an unattached company for a period of one year. On October 1, 1921, it was redesignated as Company E, 159th Infantry.***
