Activities:

The Second Separate Company, Infantry, California National Guard was organized and mustered into the State Service May 28, 1924, at Palo Alto, California. Robert C. Sarson was selected Captain. Robert J. Hackenberger and Wesley M. Arganbright were selected to serve as First and Second Lieutenants, respectively. About one month later, on July 1, 1924, the Second Separate Company, Infantry was redesignated Company G, 159th Infantry Regiment.***
