A	June 27, 1916	The Second Regiment of Infantry was called into the service of the United States June 19, 1916. Left home station for Mobilization camp June twenty-third. Left Sacramento for Nogales, Arizona, June thirtieth. Arrived at Nogales July third. Performed guard and patrol duty in and near Nogales. Short practice marches, drill and target practice. School of instruction. September eighth Regiment marched twelve miles to Santa Cruz River for bivouac. Returned to camp September ninth. As part of the First California Brigade, the Regiment started on practice march to Fort Huachuca for target practice and field exercises. September tenth marched seven miles to Santa	Earl L.
