of California Field  
Artillery on Patagonia  
Road near the Santa Cruz  
River during which time  
approximately fifteen  
miles of wire were laid  
and messages handled.  
And on September seventeenth  
and eighteenth the company  
participated in maneuvers  
with the Connecticut Infantry  
in the same district, laid  
eight miles of wire, establish-  
ed eight stations and eleven  
messages were transmitted.  
Company B entrained at Nogales  
October nineteenth and arrived  
at Los Angeles, California,  
October twenty-first, and  
established camp at Exposi-  
tion Park, Los Angeles, where  
they were stationed until  
mustered out of the service.
