HISTORY OF CMA

This year marks the 26th year of the California Military Academy, the principal source

of junior officers for the California Army National Guard.

The goal of the academy remains unchanged -- to provide qualified, enthusiastic Second Lieutenants to the Army Reserve components. CMA graduates are commissioned in virtually all branches and within a year are assigned to the basic officer course at their branch school. The combination of CMA and branch school training provides a militarily qualified and professionally schooled officer to units throughout the state.

The majority of those who complete this program are assigned to units of the National Guard, although in recent years several officers have been assigned to the United States Army Reserve, which utilizes the CMA program as an avenue towards commissioning for qualified enlisted personnel. Numerous CMA graduates have entered the active Army; many have com-

piled distinguished records both in Vietnam and in a variety of domestic posts.

We strive to create a motivated trained officer; the benefits to the individual and to the unit are obvious. It is our stated intent, as well as our visible achievement, to present such individuals to you as newly-commissioned officers.

CMA CLASS OF 1977

Many are the paths to success in the modern Army National Guard of today. While some men and women prefer enlisted service to achieve the goals of national defense, others aspire to the officer corps.

With the graduation ceremonies June 11, 1977, 115 young men and women completed the challenge which took them through a year of tedious training at the California Military Academy. The regard for this rigorous schooling has additional responsibility--the responsibility which goes with a commission as a second lieutenant in the California Army National Guard and the United States Army Reserve.

From the first day of Phase I it was apparent that adversity would be a part of the testing of mental and physical endurance which leads to graduation. Classroom instruction was to be with us for a full year, but it was the simulated pressure of combat that helped develop leaders during Phase II at Camp San Luis Obispo. The cadence of rigorous schooling and hardening process which temper both body and spirit took its toll and it was apparent that

only the truly dedicated would "tough it out".

During the 10 weekend drill periods of Phase III, instructional periods were well planned and presented. The weeding-out process continued as we applied classroom learned principles to actual situations. We were beginning to discover that we didn't know all the answers, but one question was being eliminated, the big question always asked by each cadet, "am I good enough?" The experiences and the confidence gained will serve as the cornerstones of the military careers of each member of the "Class of 1977".

With diligence and sincerity we, as CMA graduates, look forward to having our future endeavors reflect the traditions, as well as the expectations of this outstanding institution. The challenge is just as big to the CMA Class of 1978, that is, to "Learn Today and Lead

Tomorrow".
