CMA At Camp Roberts

This year marks the 31st year of the California Military Academy, the principal source of junior officers for the California Army National Guard.

This year also marks the first time in a long time that Camp Roberts has been utilized for training of CMA cadets.


The camp was acquired by the United States in 1940 and almost immediately construction of a huge training site was begun. The first commanding officer of the camp was Lieutenant Colonel Oliver Marston, who with plans, specifications and a few tents began the job of building a training site that could house and train 30,000 men. Eight thousand workers would be called to assist in the building of the camp before it's completion in March of 1941.

During the construction of the camp the name Roberts was selected as the name of the new post. The name was chosen in memory of Corporal Harold W. Roberts, who gave his life while assisting his comrades in combat during WWI.

Today Camp Roberts plays an active role in the training of military men and women for both Active and Reserve Component units throughout the western United States. Camp Roberts also is used for research and development testing by various DOD agencies and civilian contractors.

Camp Roberts continues to serve as an example of the "Total Force" concept, providing coordination and assistance in achieving the common goal: Combat Readiness.

The California Military Academy as well continues to achieve it's goal of creating a motivated and well trained officer living by the motto: LEARN TODAY - LEAD TOMORROW.

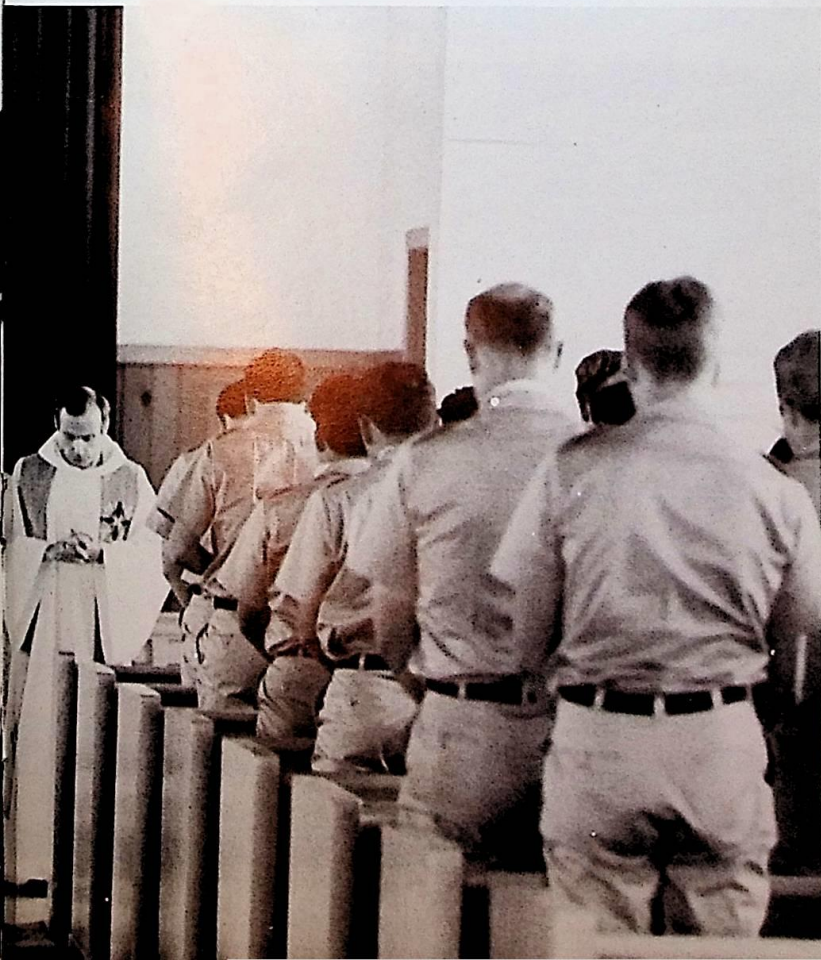

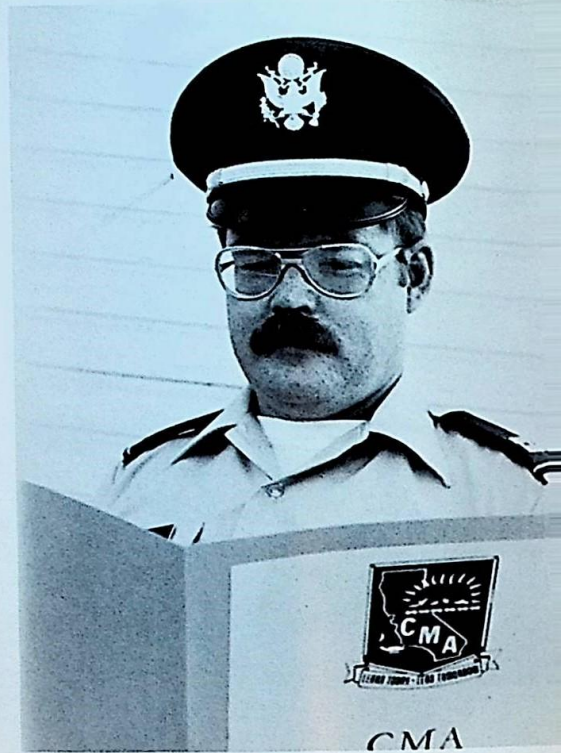

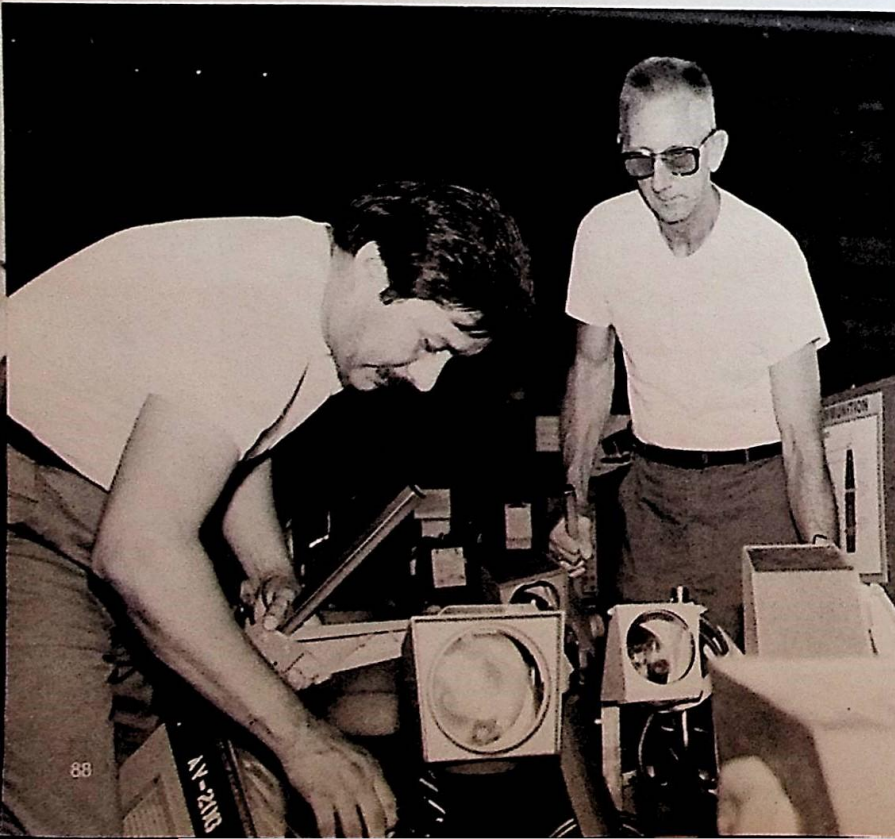

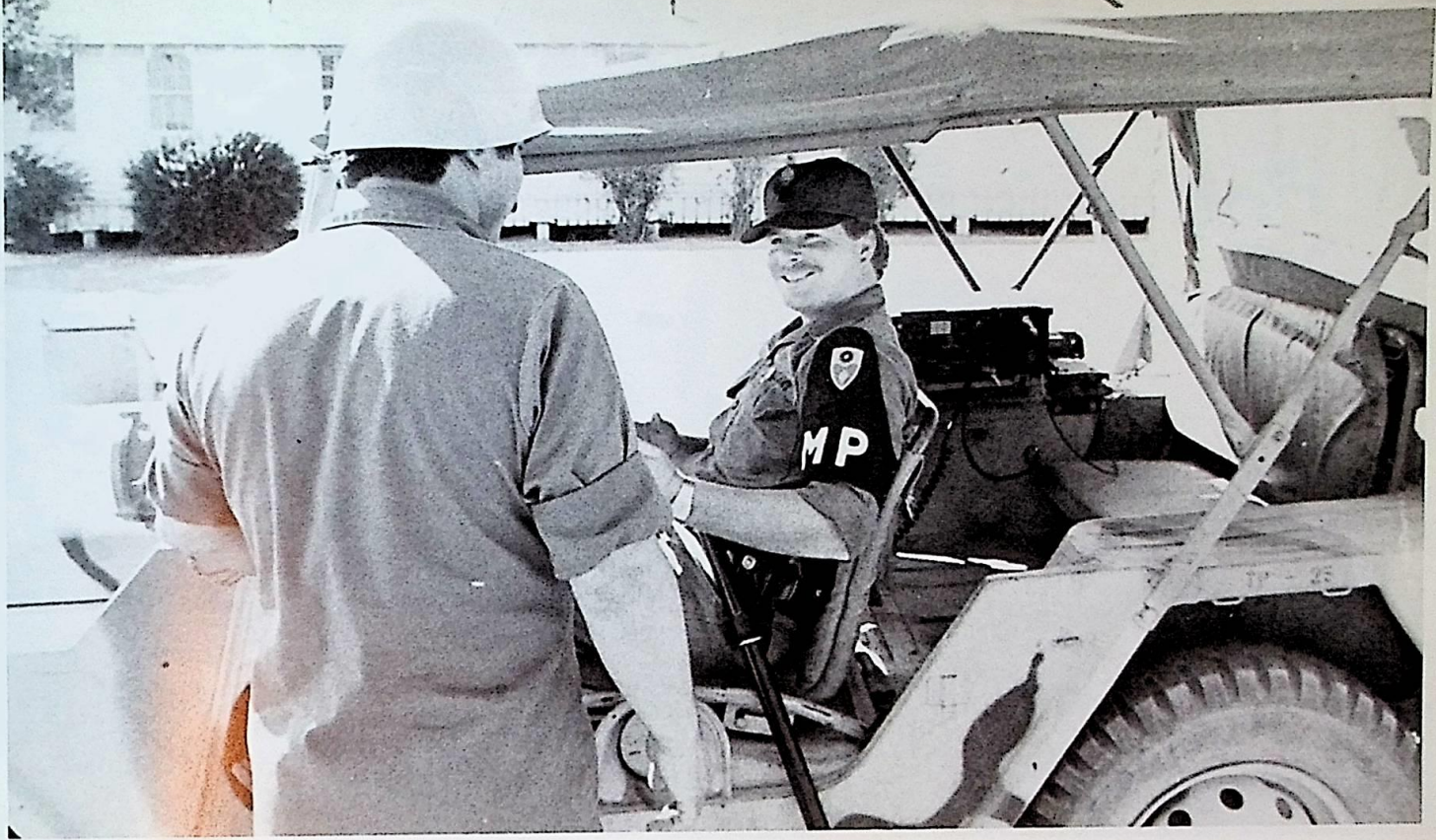

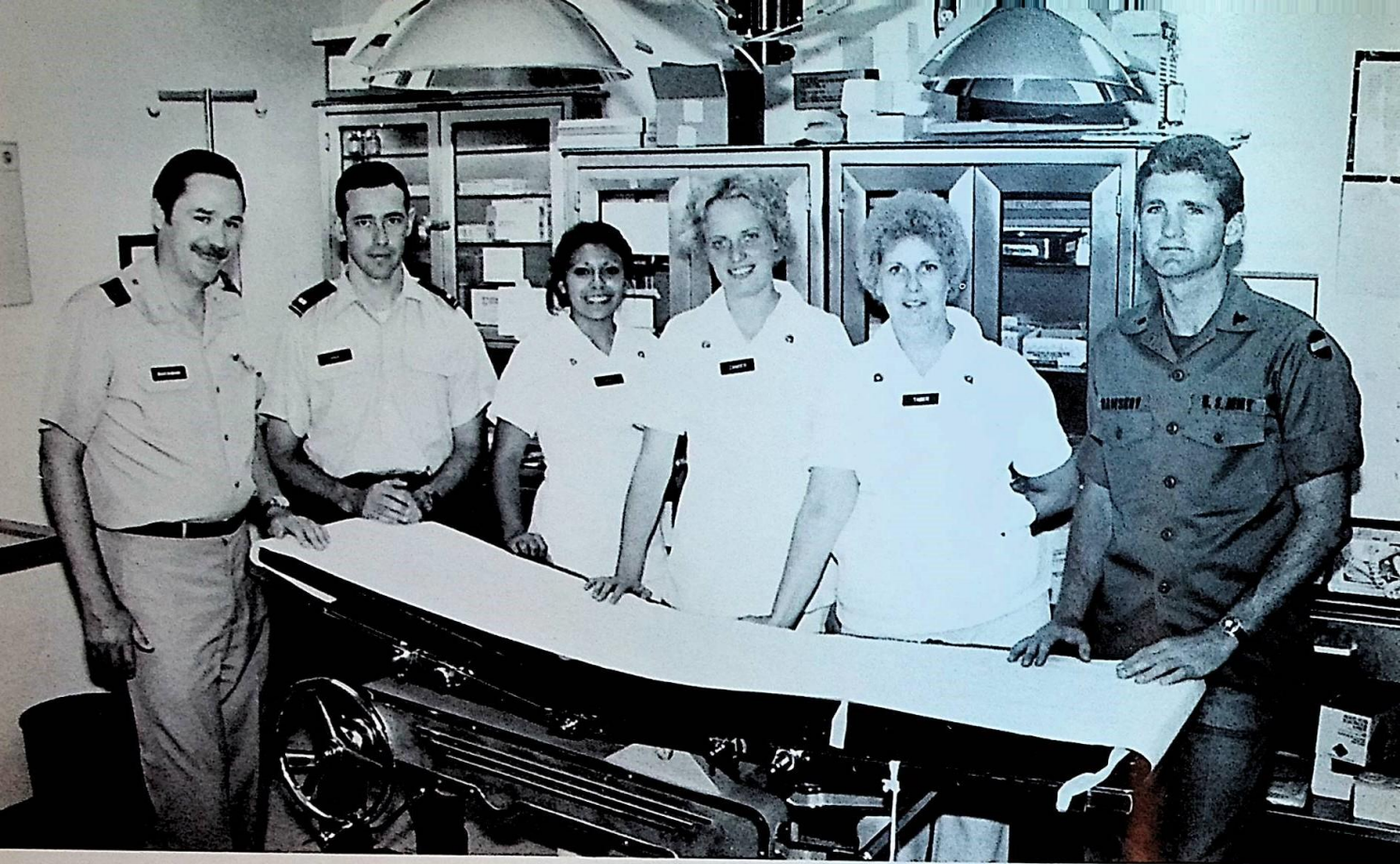

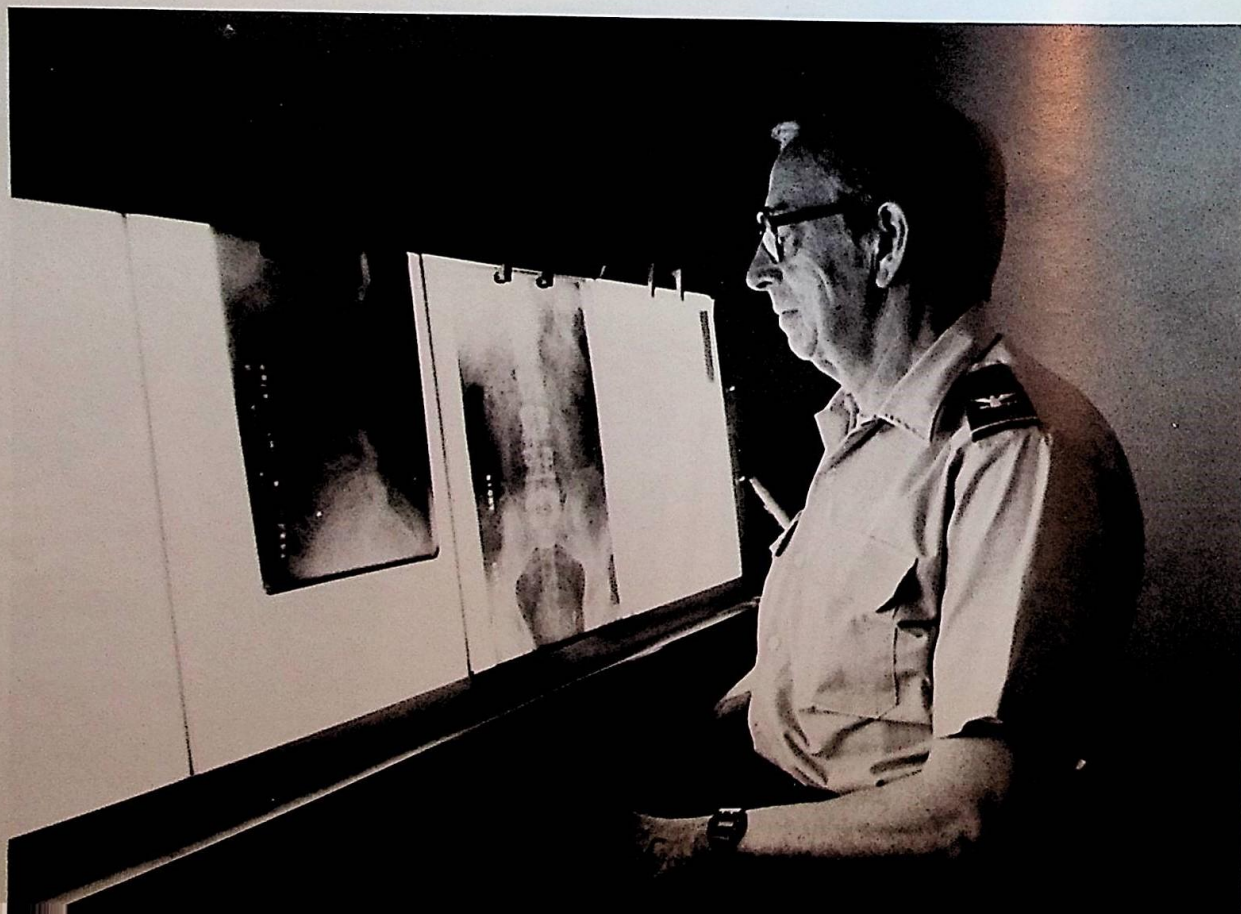

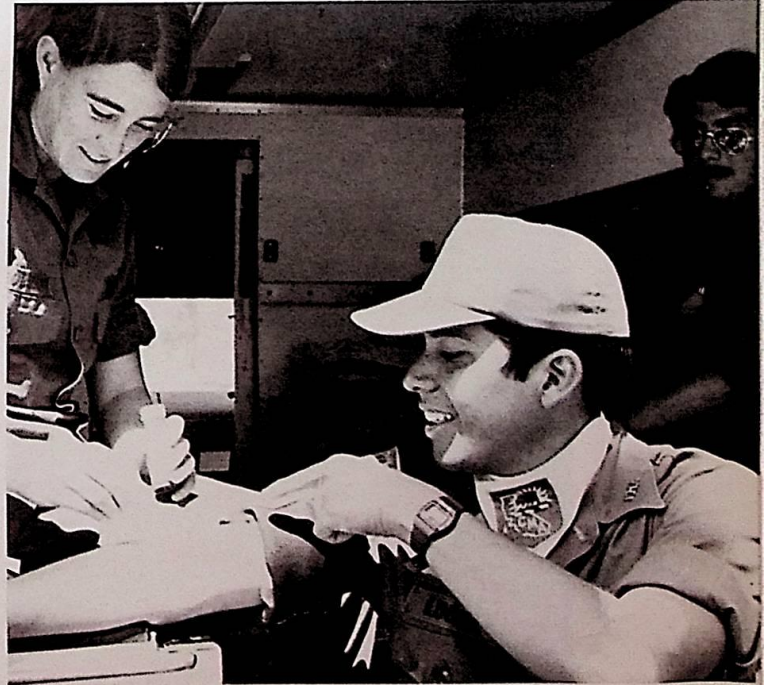
